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TRAINING OF THE TRAINERS. DERAD AND TRAINING AID

Background

The 2011 study JIHADIST RADICALISATION IN EUROPEAN PRISONS (JLS/2007/ISEC/551) revealed that prisons may become highly dangerous breeding grounds for out-and-out recruitment of new adepts in the army of terror or within O.C. and gangs. Prisoners and probationers convicted of non-terrorist related crimes might still escalate towards violent attitudes due to the influence of other prisoners or social groups they engage in, seeking for protection or within classical prison gangs dynamics and based upon specific grievances.

Despite the relevance of this issue for judiciary and judicial staff, courses of this type from a legal perspective are neither available through the e-Justice web-portal, nor in key relevant studies, while some initiative have been developed for LEAs through the CEPOL portal. The action builds on existing quality methodologies defined by the EJTN “Report Implementation of the Pilot Project – European Judicial Training Study on Best Practices in training of judges and prosecutors” and capitalize from networks, experiences, materials, platform and methodologies gained through the projects.

For this reason, DERAD and TRAINING AID aim to contribute to the alignment of European CVE strategies with MS initiatives in the field of probation and alternative measures as tools to counter radicalisation. In this sense DERAD is implementing as a part of the project six training courses for trainers among EU practitioners with the objective to harmonize knowledge through the peer training and refine customizable course adaptable to different national legislation and regulations. In this sense, some of those practitioners will be responsible for cascade training in their own country.

Objective

The projects aim to reach basically five main goals, to exchange information and best practices on countering radicalisation and terrorism through the rule of the law at European and Inter-Agency levels, as well as explore the opportunities offered from FD 909/829/947 to deescalate tensions and de-potentiate grievances leading to recruitment and terrorism among prisoners and probationers.

The harmonization of MS policies and coordination between judiciary, prison staff and social workers in the area of rehabilitation and re-socialisation is one key objective that the projects aim to reach in order to be a useful tool for main stakeholders. In this sense and bearing in mind the requests from stakeholders and researchers it is necessary to promote a “Knowledge Partnership” between EJTN, CEPOL, universities, judicial and police schools and Ministries as stated in one of the flagships of the Europe 2020 Strategy which is another strategic goal for the members of the consortium. Those points will be crucial to help MSs who didn’t adopt the FDs to test their implementation and advantages with a grassroots approach through practical examples and peer groups.

As one of the cornerstones of the project, the training of trainers has the primary objective to provide competence and skills to prevent and contrast the emergence of radical phenomena within the European prisons, through the use of multifaceted, multidimensional and multidisciplinary methods and tools. Trainers from 9 European countries will be acquainted with the most advanced methods to combine judicial and police cooperation as part of the judicial and psycho-social prevention activities.

We will use proactive blended training methodology, integrated with Living Lab approaches, which will allow participants to customize and deliver then tailor-made cascade training at national level and become part of a practitioner’s community of counter-radicalisation experts at pan-European level.

The projects aim to deliver more that 40 courses around 26 countries in Europe and train more than 2,000 trainers.

This trainer of trainers takes place at the Euro-Arab Foundatiton for Higher Studies and will be conducted in English.

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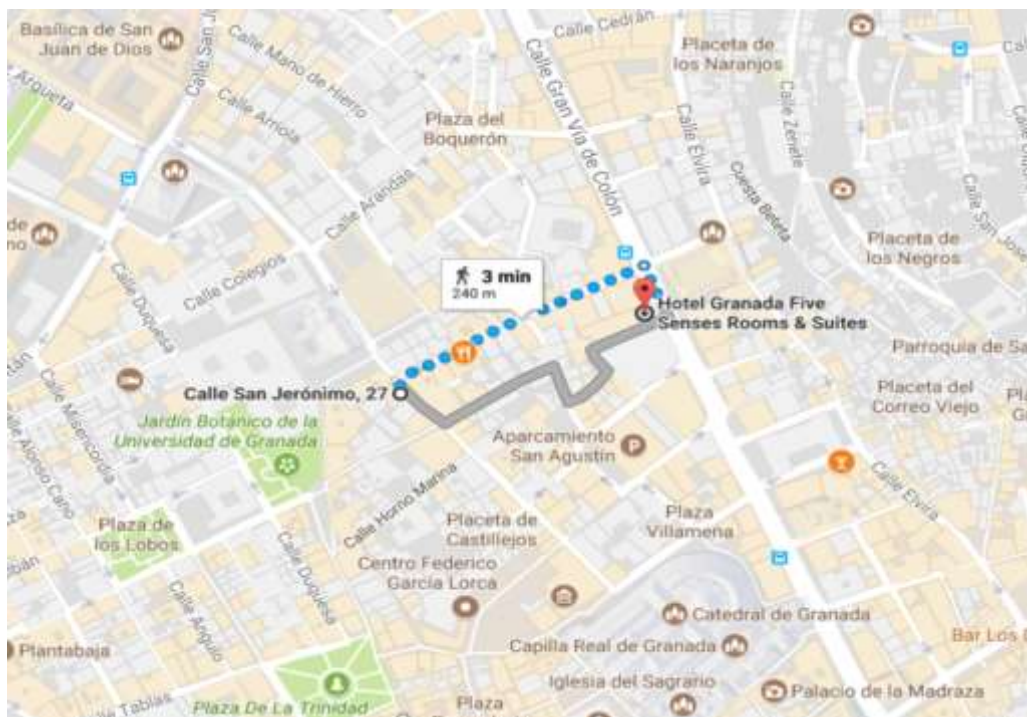


THE HOTEL: GRANADA FIVE SENSES ROOMS & SUITES

TRANSPORTATION

How to arrive from granada airport

Line Granada-Airport

If you arrive to Granada Airport, you can take bus or taxi to the Hotel. Taxi Airport - City Centre is around 30 €. Buses run after each flight arrival and stop just in the same street of the Hotel (Gran Vía Street). Ticket price is 2,90 € per trip. You can buy ticket directly in the bus or in advance in the web: <https://www.alsa.es>

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How to arrive from malaga airport

If you fly to Málaga airport you can get as well a bus from Málaga Airport to Granada, leaving you in the Granada Bus Station. The total cost is around 25 € for a go and return ticket depending on the time and bus. You should buy ticket in advance in <https://www.alsa.es>

(Please take care of select departure from Málaga Airport, not city)

How to arrive from granada bus station

The Granada bus station is located on the outskirts of Granada, to get from the bus station to the Cathedral which is close the Five Senses Hotel you have to catch the SN1 bus that goes directly from the bus station to the Cathedral located at Gran Vía street: it is not necessary to change buses.
